Congregational Business Meeting

At the recent congregational business meeting, the congregation heard each committee's current reports and financial reports. The members also approved the officers for 2024, called deacons and appointments. Church leaders for 2024 will be presented in the January Dunker. The 2023 Mid-Atlantic District Conference

The Mid-Atlantic District Conference for 2023 was held at Manassas Church of the Brethren on October 6th and 7th. The conference was attended by Doris Grossnickle (a member of the Planning team) and Tom and Pam Jouannet (Delegates for the Saturday business). It was so wonderful seeing and re-connecting with our sisters and brothers in the district in the most welcoming Manassas Church.

The business sessions consisted of the usual selection of new officers and leadership team members and the various reports from Church of the Brethren commissions and district camps. In addition, some by-law changes were approved including creation of an Executive Team to assist the District Leadership Team.

The workshops were very engaging this year. Pam attended the one run by Doris which consisted of assembling Health Kits from district churches to be donated to Church World Service (including the ones donated by Grossnickle Church this past summer). It was good exercise walking around the tables to fill up ziplock bags. Tom attended a discussion of the various ways small churches can fill their pulpits with shared ministers and lay-ministry people. We assembled almost 800 health kits to donate to Church World Service.

At the end of the business session, a copy of the query brought by Arlington Church of the Brethren was passed out to the attendees of the conference. The query is addressed to the denomination as a whole. The query is requesting changes in the 1983 human sexuality paper. There is outdated language which they are asking to update. There will be multiple chances for listening sessions where people will be able to ask questions and share meaningful conversations. If you are interested in viewing the query and/or would like to participate in the listening session, there are also paper copies for you to pick up at the church. Please contact Angie and she will get you a paper copy.
