Snow Schedule for Worship

All the monies collected will go to help them purchase food to help our less fortunate neighbors. MPHP's need has doubled as people struggle to make ends meet. We thank you so much for your participation and your generous donations.

There will be people holding our "Soup Pots" when worship is over and you can drop money or checks (make payable to Grossnicle Church with Souper Bowl in memo line) in pot as leaving church. There will be no 2¢ worth collection this month.

Update from the board:

At a recent board meeting, the board approved a contract extension for Pastor Greg. His contract, at 50% time, has been extended until the end of March. The board also formed a calling team to provide a focus for anchor ministry discussed in the October Dunker. Blessings in a Backpack with Middletown People Helping People (MPHP)


